### **REQUIREMENTS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS**

Academic requirements	Although a specific minimum GPA is not required, incoming students should be in <b>good academic standing</b> .
Language requirements	With most of our partners we have agreed that the language proficiency will be certified by each home university confirming the level is equivalent to at least B2 in English or Italian and students will not be required to submit an official language test result for the exchange program.

	Please notice that <b>knowledge of Italian language is not</b> <u>required</u> for students studying in English.
	From our partner Universities with whom we have not agreed on a language certificate waiver we will require one of the following proofs of language proficiency for English OR Italian language to study at Luiss.
For Italian:	A minimum of <b>B2</b> of the CEFRL or equivalent. Italian language proficiency can be certified by the home university.
For English:	IELTS score a minimum of 6 TOEFL IBT score - minimum grade 78 Cambridge B2 First - minimum grade B Cambridge C1 Advanced - minimum grade C All certificates must be valid and obtained starting from September 2022.

	The students that attend the courses and comply with the requirements will receive a certificate and gain 3 ECTS credits, per semester.

### **EXAMINATION PERIODS AND ASSESSMENT**

### Luiss Uniqueness - Enquiry-based learning

Luiss Uniqueness is an educational approach which combines academic rigor and practical relevance to equip students with the critical thinking required to solve daily and future challenges. At the heart of the Luiss ethos is its enquiry-based learning model, which teaches students how to formulate qualified questions and informed opinions about the complex world in which we live. This unique approach is student-oriented and involves curricular and extracurricular activities that connect students with Luiss university's privileged network of real-world practitioners in business, institutions, and public administration. Via guest lectures, research projects and teamwork, students

		experience meaningful learning and see first-hand how to play an active and valuable role in society. The Luiss educational journey is one of investigation, innovation, interaction and interdisciplinarity.		
Examination periods		Exams are held after the teaching period and can be oral, written or both. Depending on the area and level, some courses will have two or three examination dates and students can choose the one they prefer.		
		Courses included in the degree programs adopting the enquiry-based model will have two examination dates available in December and January or May and June depending on the semester and study period. Please note that for fully enquiry-based courses students will have to choose just one exam date (even if there are two available). For these courses the students' performance will be continuously assessed throughout the whole semester and will constitute the main component of their final grade. The traditional final exam will account for no more than 30%.		
		The exact examination dates for each subject will be defined about a month and a half before the beginning of the examination session.		
		Students should make their <u>travelling arrangements according</u> to the examination periods.








# Student services and facilities

Studying at Luiss Guido Carli means becoming part of a dynamic and international community that shares academic endeavors, enthusiasm and experience. Students take on an active role in their education and can count on a close relationship with faculty members.

### The student office

The Student Office supports and supplies students with all the information they need for their academic life. The Office takes care of the following: enrollment, admission to degree courses, payment of fees, scholarships - financial aid, sitting examinations, choosing a study plan, degree examination, changing degree course and transferring from another university.

### The library

The library specializes in social sciences, particularly in law, economics and political science. It holds about 110,000 books, over 1,150 paper journals (337 of which are current issues), 237 databases and electronic collections, and it provides access to over 102,000 e-journals. In 1999-2000, the library received two valuable donations, from Ungari with approximately 10,000 volumes specialized in human rights, and from Fondo Puija, specialized in criminal law.

### The career services office

The Career Services Office offers an orientation and a professional training service for all Luiss final-year students and recent graduates. It provides help and support in approaching the job market. The Career Services office organizes internships and apprenticeships, offers professional orientation services, counseling, assessment days, seminars on CVs, job and career days, and gives employers assistance in searching and selecting CVs.

### **Cultural activities**

Luiss Guido Carli organizes photography and writing contests, theater labs and other cultural activities in which Luiss students can take part. The University also has agreements with several theaters in Rome, offering students cut price tickets or discount season tickets.

### Luiss language café

The Luiss Language Café is a multilingual center for creativity and cultural exchange and will serve as a hub of activity for sharing knowledge, skills and initiatives that will involve everyone throughout the university. In the open lounge of the café, as well as enjoying the free tea and coffee, students can browse through a wide range of prominent international newspapers and magazines, but also ask for a reservation of the theatre or one of the three production rooms.

### Luiss LOFT

The Luiss LOFT is a hub for students, staff, professors and PhD candidates to explore and stimulate their creativity while delving into tech culture, creativity, design and digital production. The LOFT's calendar of events ranges from the Internet of Things, design and coding to songwriting and digital skills to open new horizons and contribute to innovative living on campus.

### **Sports**

The goal of Luiss Sports is to make students participate and feel part of a community through sports. You can practice all kinds of sports at Luiss, such as basketball, soccer, volleyball, rugby and athletics. Sports activities take place at the University sports center PALALuiss, at the Acqua Acetosa field, and the CUS field.

### The university radio and WebTV

The University web radio, set up in 2006, is run entirely by students. It offers entertainment, good music, cultural programs, news, interviews and much more. All students are welcome to take part in the radio's activities, and some programs are also held by Erasmus incoming students. In September 2008 Luiss launched its WebTV.

### **University canteen**

There are two canteens at Luiss Guido Carli and they offer meals on weekdays and lunch on Saturdays. They are located at the two campuses: viale Pola 12 and viale Romania 32.

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The Student Mobility office promotes student exchanges within the Erasmus+ Program as well as through Bilateral Agreements with non-European partner universities.

The office is responsible for all aspects of student mobility in all areas of study. It also deals with orientation and registration of incoming students within exchange programs.





### Things you should know

By the end of January of every academic year, we send all our partners updated materials, application procedures and documents for exchange students. You should ask the coordinator of your university for the following information and Luiss application documents:

- Information on how to get accommodation at Luiss and the application form for housing.

Read the instructions carefully before you apply.

Search our web site from time to time: pages are updated when new information is available. Check the web pages of Luiss Professors (under Search for courses) for detailed information about courses.

Luiss offers extensive Italian language courses in both semesters to exchange students. The courses are at three levels (beginner, intermediate and advanced) and they are free of charge.

At Luiss the languages of instruction are Italian and English. Information about the degree programs taught entirely in English can be found on our website.

### Luiss language requirements for exchange students

Luiss student exchange agreements are based on mutual trust in selecting students and language proficiency certified by each home institution.

Students selected for an exchange should be proficient in the language of instruction at the host university. With most of our partners we have agreed that language proficiency will be certified by each home university, confirming that the level is adequate.

Students will not be required to submit the results of an official language test for the exchange program.

From our partner universities with whom we have not agreed on a language certificate waiver we will require proof of language proficiency for English and/or Italian to study at Luiss.

Non-native speakers of English or Italian should provide the following proof of proficiency:

### Steps to apply

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### First step: nomination

If you have been selected to study at Luiss as an exchange student, first of all you must be nominated by your home university (nomination deadline: 8 May for both I and II semester)

### ${\bf Second\,step:} registration$

After being nominated by the home university, exchange students will receive an e-mail with an access code (token) and instructions to register in our on-line Web Self-Service Platform. Students must register to the Web Self-Service (registration deadline: 15 May)

Enter the access code, first name, last name and date of birth. The information entered must match the data we received from home university.

If registration is successful, students will be allowed to login to the system using the newly assigned username and password. We recommend saving this page, print it, or note down the credentials for future use (a copy will also be sent to the students email address).

By logging into the system students will be able to proceed to the next step.

### Third step: application

From the Web Self-Service user page, in the left-hand pane, students should click on Study abroad > Application Form for Incoming students (Erasmus/Exchange).

Students will have to upload a scan of the following (we suggest preparing scans in this phase):

- A recent photograph (35x40mm, max 5MB, in jpeg, jpg, bmp or pjpeg). \*
- ID card (for Schengen countries) or passport for non-EU students.\*
- Updated transcript of records in English.\*
- Language certificates (if required, check with home university).
- You can apply for housing through the Luiss Accommodation Office – you will find the link to the form while filling out your application to Luiss.

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### **Acceptance letters**

From the beginning of June, as soon as application forms are processed, Student Mobility will send the incoming students an acceptance letter and practical information via email.

### Application deadline for II semester

Please note that Luiss does not accept a second round of selected students for the II semester (Spring), after the summer.

Very few exceptions can be made, and they have been agreed on with the partners involved.

# Administrative formalitie

### Visa and permit of stay for non-Schengen citizens

Non-Schengen citizens should go to the Italian diplomatic offices (embassy or consulate) and apply for a Study Visa as soon as they receive their letter of admission from Luiss Guido Carli University.

Within eight days from arrival, students must apply for a permit of stay. To do so, they must bring:

- The acceptance letter
- A declaration of sufficient means of support
- An original bank statement
- Private health insurance valid in Italy (please note that private insurances from home countries are not accepted at the *Questura*, unless an official document from the Italian embassy or consulate for the home country states the insurance's validity)

Detailed information on how to apply for a permit of stay will be given upon your arrival.

All exchange students are required to have an insurance policy (translated in Italian) covering medical care and third-party liability, valid on the national territory for a year or for the period of stay in Italy. For students from countries that are members of the European Union some medical costs are generally covered by their national health service. All European students should have the European Health Insurance Card - EHIC.

## Getting around

### **Public transportation**

Rome has an integrated public transport network operated by the companies ATAC – Cotral – FS- Ferrovie dello Stato. The system includes a network of metro, bus, tram and metro-type rail service.

Bus and tram services (ATAC) cover the center of the city and the suburbs. They operate from 5:30 am to 12:00 pm. Night bus service is available from midnight to 5:30 am. Night busses are recognized by the number followed by the letter N (notturno).

There are three metro lines, A, B and C which connect extra urban and peripheral zones with the center.

- Metro line A runs from Battistini Station, situated northwest of the city, to Anagnina Station in the southwest. Trains circulate from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm (until 1:30 am on Fridays and Saturdays).
- Metro line B runs from Rebibbia station, situated north-east of the city, to Laurentina Station to the south.
   Trains circulate from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm (until 1:30 am on Fridays and Saturdays).
- Metro line C runs from Parco di Centocelle station to Monte Compatri-Pantano Station to the south. Trains circulate from 5:30 am to 23:30 pm.

The only station where you can transfer from line A to line B is Termini Station.

A shuttle train called the Leonardo Express, leaving every 30 minutes (from 6:37 am to 11:37 pm) links Fiumicino International Airport with Termini Central Station. The price of the ticket is  $\epsilon$ 14 for one ride.

For information about bus and tram service (ATAC) you can call the number +39 06 57 003 or check the website www.atac.roma.it. Information can also be found in Tuttocittà, a street map which is issued annually along with Rome telephone directories.

You can also ask at any tourist information stand for a free map of the transportation network.

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Insurance

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### **Taxis**

Single tickets (€ 1.50) allow you to use all means of public transportation within the metropolitan area of Rome for up to 100 minutes.

Monthly passes cost €35 and last for the calendar month, so we recommend buying them at the beginning of the month.

NB Single or monthly tickets must be bought before boarding the bus. They can be purchased at ATAC kiosks (check them on this website: https://www.atac.roma.it/en/utilit y/sales-channels/ticket-offices), newssta-nds, tabacchi (tobacco shops) or from automatic ticket machines. Single tickets must be validated when you begin your journey.

Validation machines are located at the rear of buses and trams, at the entry gates of metro stations and within the entrance area of all rail stations.

Taxis in Rome are quite expensive; charges vary by distance, time of day and extra charges (supplementi).

A taxi is, however, the easiest form of transportation for students arriving in Rome at Fiumicino International Airport (average fare about  $\mathfrak{C}50$ ).

## Living in Rome

### Money

On January 1st, 2002, the Euro was introduced as legal currency in Italy, substituting the Italian *Lira*.

Banks are usually open from Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm and from 2:45 pm to 3:45 pm. If you wish to open a bank account in Italy, you will first have to obtain your *Codice Fiscale* (taxpayer's code number).

Credit cards are widely accepted in restaurants, hotels, railway stations and shops.

We recommend that students bring along a sufficient amount of Euros or travelers checks to cover immediate necessities (keep in mind that there are considerable delays involved in transferring money to Italy from abroad!)

### Accommodation

Student Mobility does not take direct responsibility for providing accommodation. The Luiss Accommodation office takes care of it based on the web application forms received (by the Student Mobility of Luiss Guido Carli) by the application deadline.

Most Erasmus students live in private apartments with Italian or international roommates in the neighborhoods near the University. The average cost is between €350-400 for a place in a double room and €450-600 for a single room per month plus utilities (telephone, electricity, heating, gas). Ask your coordinator for a copy of the accommodation documents. Please read the booking conditions carefully, follow the instructions and complete the application form.

Students that wish to take care of housing themselves are advised to come to Rome well in advance before classes begin.

### **Electricity**

Electric current in Italy is 220 volts. You might need an adaptor and/or a converter.

### **Entertainment**

Cinema tickets cost about €8-10 (with a reduced price of about €5 for students). Movies in English are also often shown.

Theatre and concerts: tickets generally vary between  $\mathfrak E$  15 and  $\mathfrak E$  40. Many associations give reductions to students.

### **Embassies and Consulates**

Most embassies are located in Rome. There are consulates in the smaller cities. Check your Ministry of Foreign Affairs for their diplomatic missions in Italy.

### **Post offices**

Post offices (Poste Italiane, www.poste.it) are open Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 13:30 pm and Saturday from 8:30 am to noon. Some offices in the center have longer opening hours; closing time is between 6 pm and 7 pm. Stamps can also be bought at the *tabacchi*.

### **Phone services**

You can buy a SIM card for about  $\[ \]$ 10 with several companies (Tim, WINDTRE, Voda-fone, Iliad) and choose a calling plan for the duration of your stay. Monthly rates range from  $\[ \]$ 10 to  $\[ \]$ 20.

### **Climate and clothing**

Italy extends 1,200 km from North to South, so the climate varies considerably, with winter temperatures of -5°C (23°F) and below in the North, and summer temperatures of 40°C (105°F) in the South. Rome, located at the center of the peninsula, has a mild climate, with temperatures rarely reaching the extremes indicated above. Consequently, light or medium-weight clothing is recommended. It is advisable, however, to bring a raincoat, and an overcoat or heavy jacket for the winter, which can get cold.


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
