## NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURES

<b>Nomination deadline</b>	<b>8 May</b> for both I (Fall) and / or II (Spring) semester
<b>Nomination procedures</b>	All exchange students must be <b>nominated by their home university</b> . The home coordinator must e-mail the <a href="#">nomination sheet</a> to <a href="mailto:in_erasmusexchange@luiss.it">in_erasmusexchange@luiss.it</a>
<b>Application period (Including housing)</b>	<b>From shortly after nomination to 15/05</b> for both I (Fall) and / or II (Spring) semester
<b>Application deadline for II semester</b>	<b>Luiss does not accept a second round of selected students for the II (Spring) semester</b> , after the summer. Very few exceptions can be made and they have been agreed on with the partners involved.
<b>Application procedures</b>	<p><b>Online application system</b></p> <p><b>Application steps for incoming students:</b> After being nominated by the home university, exchange students will receive an email with an <b>access code</b> (token) and instructions to <b>register</b> to our online Web Self-Service Platform.</p> <p><b>Registration</b> Students must register to the Web Self-Service. Enter the <b>access code</b>, first name, last name and date of birth. The information entered must match the data we received from home university.</p> <p>If registration is successful, students will be allowed to login to the system using their <b>newly assigned username and password</b>. <b>We recommend saving this page or noting down the credentials for future use</b> (a copy will also be sent to the student's e-mail address).</p> <p>By logging into the system students will be able to proceed to the next step.</p> <p><b>Application</b> From the Web Self-Service user page, in the right-hand page, students should click on Study abroad &gt; Application Form for Incoming students (Erasmus/Exchange).</p> <p><b>Students will have to upload the following scanned documents:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A recent photograph (35x40mm, max 5MB, in JPEG, JPG, BMP or PJPEG) *</li> <li>• ID card (for Schengen countries) or passport for non-EU students*</li> <li>• Updated transcript of records in English*</li> <li>• Language certificates (if required, check with home university)</li> </ul> <p>* Compulsory attachments</p>

## REQUIREMENTS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

<b>Academic requirements</b>	Although a specific minimum GPA is not required, incoming students should be in <b>good academic standing</b> .
<b>Language requirements</b>	With <b>most of our partners</b> we have agreed that the language proficiency will be certified by each home university confirming the level is equivalent to at least <b>B2 in English or Italian</b> and <b>students will not be required to submit an official language test result for the exchange program</b> .

Please notice that **knowledge of Italian language is not required for students studying in English.**

**From our partner Universities with whom we have not agreed on a language certificate waiver we will require one of the following proofs of language proficiency for English OR Italian language to study at Luiss.**

<b>For Italian:</b>	A minimum of <b>B2</b> of the CEFR or equivalent. Italian language proficiency can be certified by the home university.
<b>For English:</b>	IELTS score a minimum of 6 TOEFL IBT score - minimum grade 78 Cambridge B2 First - minimum grade B Cambridge C1 Advanced - minimum grade C <b>All certificates must be valid and obtained starting from September 2022.</b>

<b>Languages of instruction</b>	Italian and English
<b>University structure</b>	3 + 2 - according to the Bologna system Undergraduate and Graduate Schools Three-year Bachelor's Degree Programs (180 ECTS credits) Two-year Master's Degree Programs (120 ECTS credits) Five years Single Cycle Graduate Program (300 ECTS credits)
<b>ECTS credits</b>	Luiss university credits are ECTS credits 1 credit is equivalent to 25 hours of study
<b>Attendance of courses</b>	Full-time attendance of courses is compulsory
<b>Average workload</b>	The average workload for Luiss students is <b>about 30 ECTS credits per semester</b> , including the Italian language courses. Four or five courses per semester are the average workload for full-time study, depending on the year of study and level.
<b>Minimum requirements</b>	It is a responsibility of the home Institution, but exchange students should <b>take at least one course</b> . Incoming <b>mobility for thesis research is not allowed</b> .
<b>Maximum number of credits</b>	Although for enrolment purposes and deadlines, exchange students will be allowed to enroll in up to 40 ECTS credits per semester, <b>they are strongly advised not to take more than 32 credits per semester</b> (not including the Italian language course).
<b>Courses exchange students can take</b>	Exchange students will be given access <b>to all the courses at Bachelor and /or Master level</b> if they <b>have the necessary prerequisites</b> and do not have timetable clashes. The more they mix Areas and levels, the more they risk to have timetable clashes. The <b>Master courses are at advanced level</b> and students <b>must have the required background and very good language competences</b> .

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**Elective courses**

Elective courses in all areas will be offered only if enough students register for the courses. The final list will be available in August.

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**The area of Law**

The area of Law offers a five-year single cycle degree program. The courses in the fourth and fifth years of study are more advanced and equivalent to Master level. In addition to this, a 3-years bachelor's degree program of 180 ECTS credits is also offered.

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**Italian language course**

Luiss offers Italian language extensive courses in both semesters for exchange students who have been admitted to attend a period of study at Luiss, under an exchange program (Erasmus+ or Bilateral Agreement).  
The courses are at three levels, beginners, intermediate and advanced **and are free of charge for the students**.

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The students that attend the courses and comply with the requirements will receive a certificate and gain 3 ECTS credits, per semester.

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**Course enrolment**

Students coming for the Fall semester will have to make a **provisional course registration** in **June/July** while students coming for the Spring will make it in **November/December**.

The **final course selection** will take place at the **beginning** of each **semester**. Students will have one week to change courses if necessary. Detailed information will be sent with the acceptance letter.

Courses have a limited capacity, and the allocation of places will take place on a first come first served basis.

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**EXAMINATION PERIODS AND ASSESSMENT**

**Luiss Uniqueness – Enquiry-based learning**

**Luiss Uniqueness** is an educational approach which combines academic rigor and practical relevance to equip students with the critical thinking required to solve daily and future challenges. At the heart of the Luiss ethos is its **enquiry-based learning model**, which teaches students how to formulate qualified questions and informed opinions about the complex world in which we live. This unique approach is student-oriented and involves curricular and extracurricular activities that connect students with Luiss university's privileged network of real-world practitioners in business, institutions, and public administration. Via guest lectures, research projects and teamwork, students

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experience meaningful learning and see first-hand how to play an active and valuable role in society. The Luiss educational journey is one of investigation, innovation, interaction and interdisciplinarity.

<p><b>Examination periods</b></p>	<p>Exams are held after the teaching period and can be oral, written or both. Depending on the area and level, some courses will have two or three examination dates and students can choose the one they prefer.</p> <p>Courses included in the degree programs <b>adopting the enquiry-based model</b> will have <b>two examination dates</b> available in December and January or May and June depending on the semester and study period. Please note that for fully enquiry-based courses students will have to choose <b>just one exam date</b> (even if there are two available). For these courses the students' performance will be continuously assessed throughout the whole semester and will constitute the main component of their final grade. The traditional final exam will account for no more than 30%.</p> <p>The exact examination dates for each subject will be defined about a month and a half before the beginning of the examination session.</p> <p><b>Students should make their <u>travelling arrangements according to the examination periods.</u></b></p>
<p><b>Final assessment</b></p>	<p><b>Exams can be taken only on the official dates.</b> Exchange students will take their exams in the same conditions as regular students. Exchange students are NOT authorized to organize their exams individually with their professors.</p>
<p><b>Proctored Exams</b></p>	<p>According to the Italian examination system <b>Luiss cannot allow proctored Exams.</b></p>
<p><b>Transcript of records</b></p>	<p>Transcripts of records will be sent by email to the Partner Institutions 4 weeks after the end the examinations periods of each examination session.</p> <p>Luiss University has embraced an eco-friendly policy and hardcopies will be sent only to those partners who explicitly request it.</p>
<p><b>Grading system</b></p> <p>30 e lode = excellent 29-30 = very good 27-28 = good 24-26 = satisfactory 18-23 = sufficient &lt; 18 = fail</p>	<p>Individual courses are graded on a scale of 18-30/30. Very brilliant students may be awarded 30 cum laude (30 e lode).</p> <p>The minimum passing grade is 18/30. <b>Grades below 18 are a fail and are not registered.</b></p> <p>Grades below 18 will not and cannot appear on the transcript of records. In Italy grades below 18 do not exist. <b>Exceptions cannot be made.</b></p>

<p><b>Application for housing</b></p>	<p>Students must apply for housing through a web form during their online application to Luiss.</p>
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### Type of housing offered

The Luiss University Accommodation Office is available **to assist** incoming exchange students in their search for housing.

Students can apply for **a room in a Luiss Residence or in an apartment shared** with other students.

There **are limited places available** and they will be assigned on a first-come first-served basis. Students will receive feedback on the outcome of their housing application by the deadline.

Students interested in living in an apartment will receive an email from [CasaLuiss](#) with customized proposals in accordance with the preferences expressed in the housing application form. The apartments are chosen among previously selected private owners and will be rented out with clear conditions and a regular contract.

## VISA AND INSURANCE

<b>Health insurance</b>	<p><b>Non-EU students</b> must hold a health insurance policy meeting the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• It must cover expenses in the event of emergency treatments and/or urgent hospitalization.</li><li>• It must cover the entire duration of your stay in Italy.</li><li>• It must be valid for the territory of all member-states applying to the Schengen Agreement in its entirety.</li><li>• It must guarantee the policy-holder's return to his/her own country in case of serious illness.</li><li>• It must be translated into English.</li></ul> <p><b>EU students</b> must bring their <b>European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)</b> which entitles the holder to get necessary treatments at the same cost as an Italian citizen. Students are advised to verify how to get the card and which services are covered with the social security administration of their country before their departure. <b>Visa application (for non-Schengen citizens)</b>	Students from non-Schengen countries, as soon as they receive the letter of admission from Luiss Guido Carli University, should go to the Italian Diplomatic Offices (Embassy or Consulate) and apply for a <b>Study Visa</b> . <b>Permit of stay (for non-Schengen citizens)</b>	After arrival, students coming from non-Schengen countries will need to apply for permit of stay. To do so students must bring the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A declaration of sufficient means of support</li><li>• A private Health Insurance valid in Italy</li><li>• The acceptance letter they received from Luiss</li></ul>



Please note that all the documents must be originals. Private insurance from home countries is sometimes not accepted at the Questura, unless an official paper from the Italian Embassy or Consulate of home country states the validity of the insurance. Students will receive detailed information before arrival with their acceptance letter.

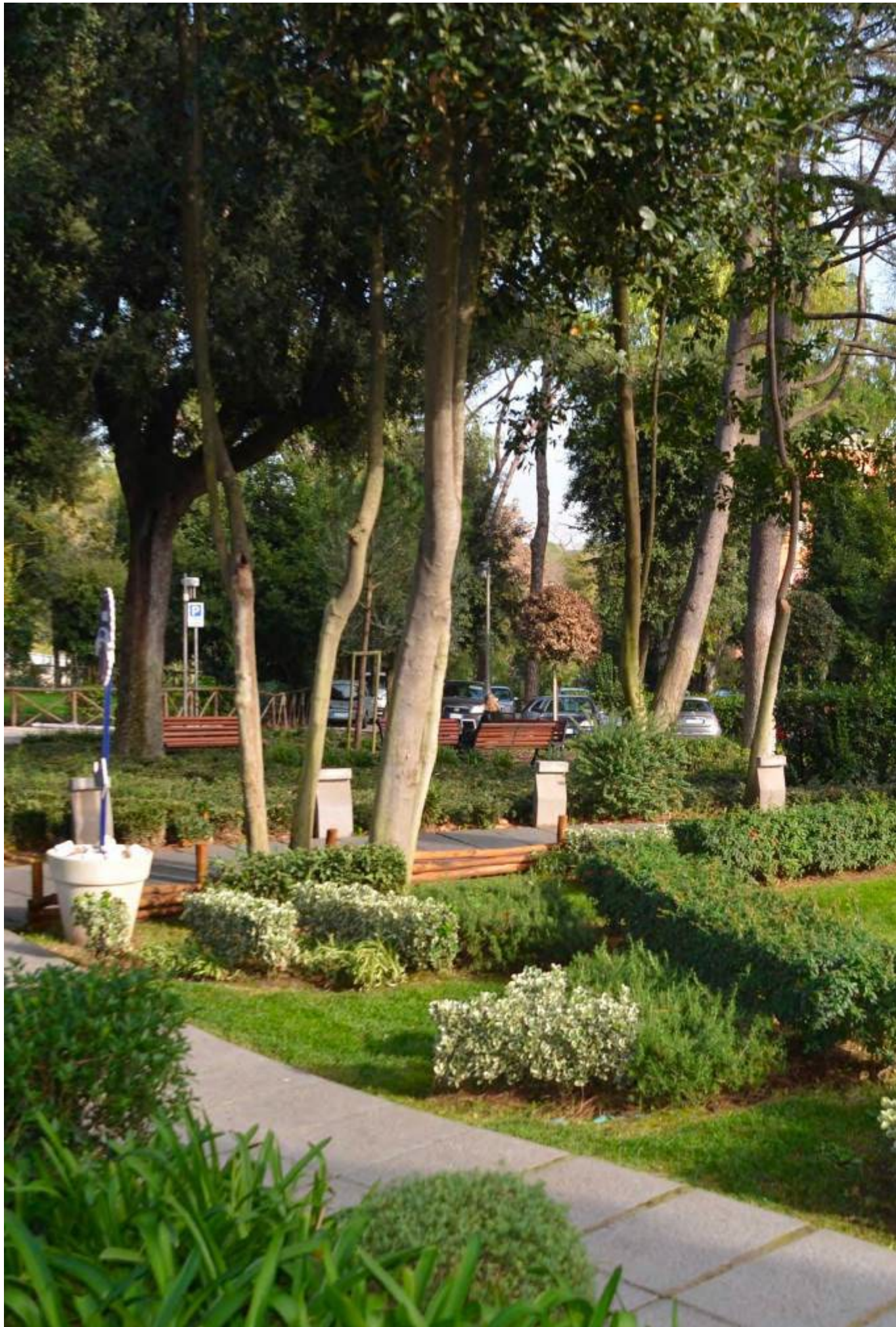

## Academic offerings

The University has two Schools that offer undergraduate and graduate degree programs.

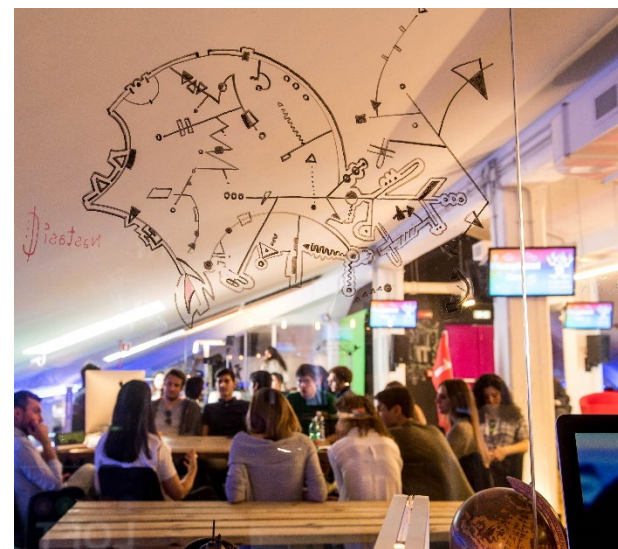




# Student services and facilities

Studying at Luiss Guido Carli means becoming part of a dynamic and international community that shares academic endeavors, enthusiasm and experience.

Students take on an active role in their education and can count on a close relationship with faculty members.



## Student facilities include

- Orientation services and tutoring
- A specialized library that may also be accessed online through the University's website
- Two University canteens
- Free medical service and emergency medical assistance
- Free psychological counseling service
- Computer rooms equipped with internet access and email for all students
- Interactive multimedia services
- Access to wi-fi
- Cultural activities such as conferences, cinema, theatre, literature and music
- Italian language courses
- Sports club
- University radio and web TV
- Luiss Green Mobility: shuttle bus and car-sharing services

## **The student office**

The Student Office supports and supplies students with all the information they need for their academic life. The Office takes care of the following: enrollment, admission to degree courses, payment of fees, scholarships - financial aid, sitting examinations, choosing a study plan, degree examination, changing degree course and transferring from another university.

## **The library**

The library specializes in social sciences, particularly in law, economics and political science. It holds about 110,000 books, over 1,150 paper journals (337 of which are current issues), 237 databases and electronic collections, and it provides access to over 102,000 e-journals. In 1999-2000, the library received two valuable donations, from Ungari with approximately 10,000 volumes specialized in human rights, and from Fondo Puija, specialized in criminal law.

## **The career services office**

The Career Services Office offers an orientation and a professional training service for all Luiss final-year students and recent graduates. It provides help and support in approaching the job market. The Career Services office organizes internships and apprenticeships, offers professional orientation services, counseling, assessment days, seminars on CVs, job and career days, and gives employers assistance in searching and selecting CVs.

## **Cultural activities**

Luiss Guido Carli organizes photography and writing contests, theater labs and other cultural activities in which Luiss students can take part. The University also has agreements with several theaters in Rome, offering students cut price tickets or discount season tickets.

## **Luiss language café**

The Luiss Language Café is a multilingual center for creativity and cultural exchange and will serve as a hub of activity for sharing knowledge, skills and initiatives that will involve everyone throughout the university. In the open lounge of the café, as well as enjoying the free tea and coffee, students can browse through a wide range of prominent international newspapers and magazines, but also ask for a reservation of the theatre or one of the three production rooms.

## **Luiss LOFT**

The Luiss LOFT is a hub for students, staff, professors and PhD candidates to explore and stimulate their creativity while delving into tech culture, creativity, design and digital production. The LOFT's calendar of events ranges from the Internet of Things, design and coding to songwriting and digital skills to open new horizons and contribute to innovative living on campus.

## **Sports**

The goal of Luiss Sports is to make students participate and feel part of a community through sports. You can practice all kinds of sports at Luiss, such as basketball, soccer, volleyball, rugby and athletics. Sports activities take place at the University sports center PALALuiss, at the Acqua Acetosa field, and the CUS field.

# Exchange at Luiss

## Who can apply?

If your university has a bilateral agreement with Luiss Guido Carli (under the Erasmus+ Program or another exchange agreement), you can apply through the International Office of your Institution. The first thing to do is to contact the coordinator at your home university.

If your university does not have an exchange agreement with Luiss:

## Things you should know

By the end of January of every academic year, we send all our partners updated materials, application procedures and documents for exchange students. You should ask the coordinator of your university for the following information and Luiss application documents:

- The 2024-2025 academic calendar.
- The 2024-2025 fact sheet.
- Information on how to get accommodation at Luiss and the application form for housing.

Read the instructions carefully before you apply.

Search our web site from time to time: pages are updated when new information is available. Check the web pages of Luiss Professors (under Search for courses) for detailed information about courses.

Luiss offers extensive Italian language courses in both semesters to exchange students. The courses are at three levels (beginner, intermediate and advanced) and they are free of charge.

At Luiss the languages of instruction are Italian and English. Information about the degree programs taught entirely in English can be found on our website.



## Luiss language requirements for exchange students

Luiss student exchange agreements are based on mutual trust in selecting students and language proficiency certified by each home institution.

Students selected for an exchange should be proficient in the language of instruction at the host university. With **most of our partners** we have agreed that language proficiency will be certified by each home university, confirming that the level is adequate.

**Students will not be required to submit the results of an official language test for the exchange program.**

**From our partner universities with whom we have not agreed on a language certificate waiver we will require proof of language proficiency** for English and/or Italian to study at Luiss.

Non-native speakers of English or Italian should provide the following proof of proficiency:

## Steps to apply

### First step: nomination

If you have been selected to study at Luiss as an exchange student, **first of all you must be nominated by your home university (nomination deadline: 8 May for both I and II semester)**

### Second step: registration

After being nominated by the home university, exchange students will receive an e-mail with an access code (token) and instructions to register in our on-line Web Self-Service Platform. Students must register to the Web Self-Service (**registration deadline: 15 May**)

Enter the access code, first name, last name and date of birth. The information entered must match the data we received from home university.

If registration is successful, students will be allowed to login to the system using the newly assigned username and password. We recommend saving this page, print it, or note down the credentials for future use (a copy will also be sent to the students e-mail address).

By logging into the system students will be able to proceed to the next step.

### Third step: application

From the Web Self-Service user page, in the left-hand pane, students should click on Study abroad > Application Form for Incoming students (Erasmus/Exchange).

Students will have to upload a scan of the following (we suggest preparing scans in this phase):

- A recent photograph (35x40mm, max 5MB, in jpeg, jpg, bmp or pjpeg). \*
- ID card (for Schengen countries) or passport for non-EU students. \*
- Updated transcript of records in English. \*
- Language certificates (if required, check with home university).
- You can apply for housing through the Luiss Accommodation Office – you will find the link to the form while filling out your application to Luiss.

Please note that Luiss does not accept a second round of selected students for the II semester (Spring), after the summer.

**Very few exceptions can be made, and they have been agreed on with the partners involved.**

## Visa and permit of stay for non-Schengen citizens

Non-Schengen citizens should go to the Italian diplomatic offices (embassy or consulate) and apply for a Study Visa as soon as they receive their letter of admission from Luiss Guido Carli University.

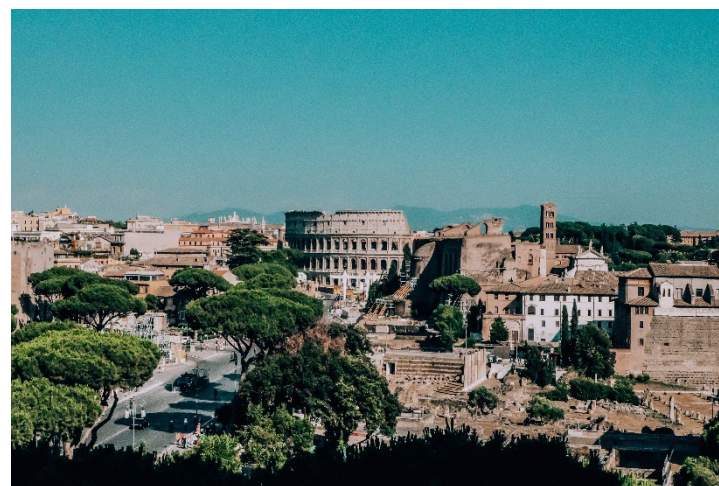
Within eight days from arrival, students must apply for a permit of stay. To do so, they must bring:

- The acceptance letter
- A declaration of sufficient means of support
- An original bank statement
- Private health insurance valid in Italy (**please note** that private insurances from home countries are not accepted at the *Questura*, unless an official document from the Italian embassy or consulate for the home country states the insurance's validity)

Detailed information on how to apply for a permit of stay will be given upon your arrival.

## Insurance

All exchange students are required to have an insurance policy (translated in Italian) covering medical care and third-party liability, valid on the national territory for a year or for the period of stay in Italy. For students from countries that are members of the European Union some medical costs are generally covered by their national health service. All European students should have the European Health Insurance Card - EHIC.



## Public transportation

Rome has an integrated public transport network operated by the companies ATAC - Cotral - FS- Ferrovie dello Stato. The system includes a network of metro, bus, tram and metro-type rail service.

Bus and tram services (ATAC) cover the center of the city and the suburbs. They operate from 5:30 am to 12:00 pm. Night bus service is available from midnight to 5:30 am. Night busses are recognized by the number followed by the letter N (*notturno*).

There are three metro lines, A, B and C which connect extra urban and peripheral zones with the center.

- Metro line A runs from Battistini Station, situated northwest of the city, to Anagnina Station in the southwest. Trains circulate from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm (until 1:30 am on Fridays and Saturdays).
- Metro line B runs from Rebibbia station, situated north-east of the city, to Laurentina Station to the south. Trains circulate from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm (until 1:30 am on Fridays and Saturdays).
- Metro line C runs from Parco di Centocelle station to Monte Compatri-Pantano Station to the south. Trains circulate from 5:30 am to 23:30 pm.

The only station where you can transfer from line A to line B is Termini Station.

A shuttle train called the Leonardo Express, leaving every 30 minutes (from 6:37 am to 11:37 pm) links Fiumicino International Airport with Termini Central Station. The price of the ticket is €14 for one ride.

For information about bus and tram service (ATAC) you can call the number +39 06 57 003 or check the website [www.atac.roma.it](http://www.atac.roma.it). Information can also be found in *Tuttocittà*, a street map which is issued annually along with Rome telephone directories.

You can also ask at any tourist information stand for a free map of the transportation network.



## Taxis

Single tickets (€ 1.50) allow you to use all means of public transportation within the metropolitan area of Rome for up to 100 minutes.

Monthly passes cost €35 and last for the calendar month, so we recommend buying them at the beginning of the month.

NB Single or monthly tickets must be bought before boarding the bus. They can be purchased at ATAC kiosks (check them on this website: <https://www.atac.roma.it/en/utility/sales-channels/ticket-offices>), newsstands, *tabacchi* (tobacco shops) or from automatic ticket machines. Single tickets must be validated when you begin your journey.

Validation machines are located at the rear of buses and trams, at the entry gates of metro stations and within the entrance area of all rail stations.

Taxis in Rome are quite expensive; charges vary by distance, time of day and extra charges (*supplementi*).

A taxi is, however, the easiest form of transportation for students arriving in Rome at Fiumicino International Airport (average fare about €50).

## Money

On January 1st, 2002, the Euro was introduced as legal currency in Italy, substituting the Italian *Lira*.

Banks are usually open from Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm and from 2:45 pm to 3:45 pm. If you wish to open a bank account in Italy, you will first have to obtain your *Codice Fiscale* (taxpayer's code number).

Credit cards are widely accepted in restaurants, hotels, railway stations and shops.

We recommend that students bring along a sufficient amount of Euros or travelers checks to cover immediate necessities (keep in mind that there are considerable delays involved in transferring money to Italy from abroad!)

## Accommodation

Student Mobility does not take direct responsibility for providing accommodation. The Luiss Accommodation office takes care of it based on the web application forms received (by the Student Mobility of Luiss Guido Carli) by the application deadline.

Most Erasmus students live in private apartments with Italian or international roommates in the neighborhoods near the University. The average cost is between €350-400 for a place in a double room and €450- 600 for a single room per month plus utilities (telephone, electricity, heating, gas). Ask your coordinator for a copy of the accommodation documents. Please read the booking conditions carefully, follow the instructions and complete the application form.

Students that wish to take care of housing themselves are advised to come to Rome well in advance before classes begin.

## Electricity

Electric current in Italy is 220 volts. You might need an adaptor and/or a converter.

## Entertainment

Cinema tickets cost about €8-10 (with a reduced price of about €5 for students). Movies in English are also often shown.

Theatre and concerts: tickets generally vary between € 15 and € 40. Many associations give reductions to students.

## Embassies and Consulates

Most embassies are located in Rome. There are consulates in the smaller cities. Check your Ministry of Foreign Affairs for their diplomatic missions in Italy.

## Post offices

Post offices (Poste Italiane, [www.poste.it](http://www.poste.it)) are open Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 13:30 pm and Saturday from 8:30 am to noon. Some offices in the center have longer opening hours; closing time is between 6 pm and 7 pm. Stamps can also be bought at the *tabacchi*.

## Phone services

You can buy a SIM card for about €10 with several companies (Tim, WINDTRE, Voda-fone, Iliad) and choose a calling plan for the duration of your stay. Monthly rates range from €10 to €20.

## Climate and clothing

Italy extends 1,200 km from North to South, so the climate varies considerably, with winter temperatures of -5°C (23°F) and below in the North, and summer temperatures of 40°C (105°F) in the South. Rome, located at the center of the peninsula, has a mild climate, with temperatures rarely reaching the extremes indicated above. Consequently, light or medium-weight clothing is recommended. It is advisable, however, to bring a raincoat, and an overcoat or heavy jacket for the winter, which can get cold.

The city of Rome offers a wide range of interesting possibilities, thanks to its ~~richness~~ richness of history, culture and art. Visitors will have the amazing opportunity to travel through history while walking on its streets: daily life doesn't just offer superb views of the Coliseum, Fontana di Trevi, the Roman Forum, Piazza di Spagna or the Pantheon, but also hides ancient secrets and modern charms in the narrow streets of the city center.

For information, the best places to make inquiries are the Tourist Information Offices located all over the center and in the main transport terminals.

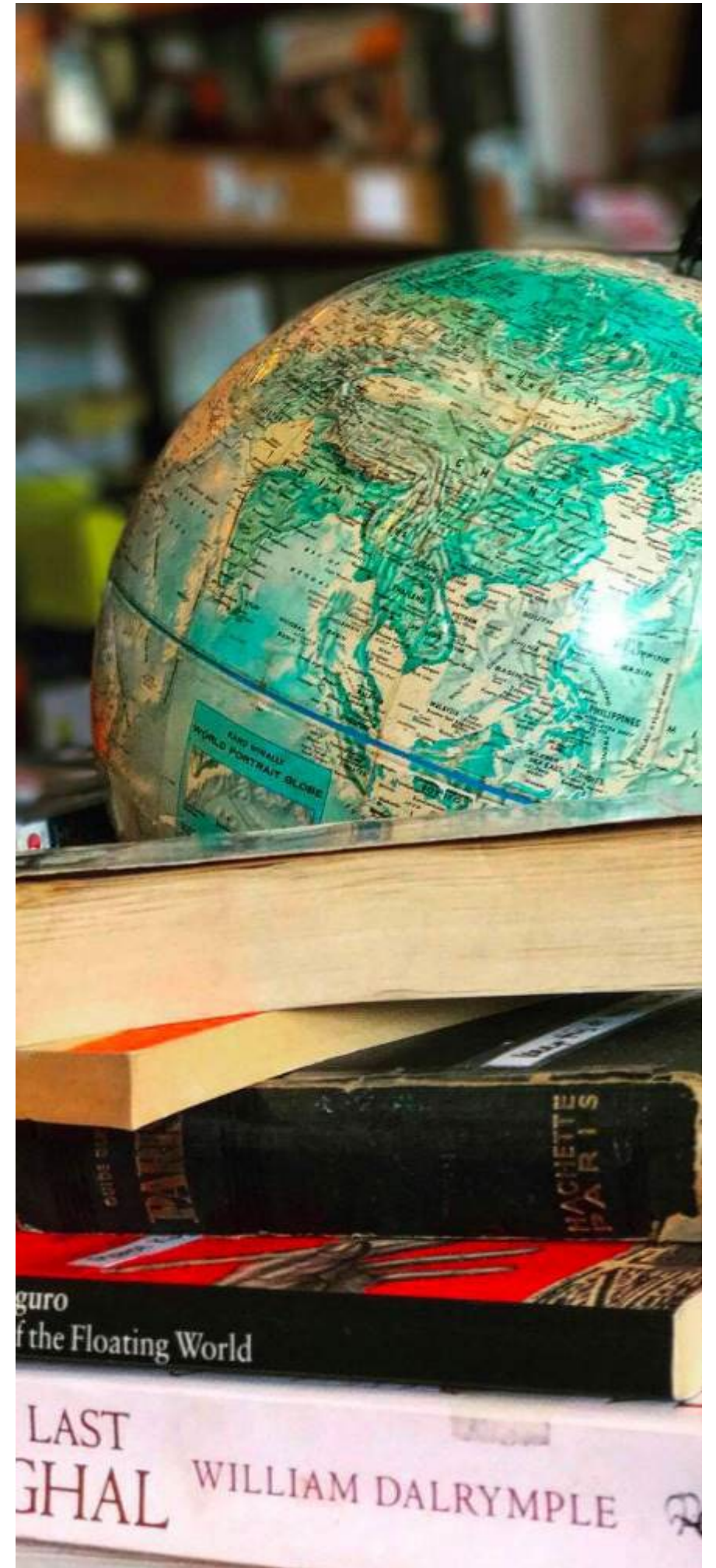
